Support for Lifelong Recovery

This past year, Cenikor provided services to 16,294 individuals. Behind that number are lives transformed, families restored, and recovery journeys at every stage. It represents people who made courageous decisions to seek help, often during some of the most challenging moments of their lives. Because of our continuum of care and our commitment to walking alongside each client as a true partner in their recovery, we remain focused not on the aggregate, but on the individual.

That is what “Support for Lifelong Recovery” means. It means meeting people where they are, in the hardest moments of their lives, and guiding them toward something better.

Over the last four years, Cenikor has invested approximately \$21 million in facility renovations and new construction. Our newest facility in Corpus Christi, completed this year, stands as one of the most meaningful expressions of that commitment. Fully rehabilitated and purpose-built for substance use disorder services, it features multiple wings designed to support clients based on their individual needs, creating focused environments that give each person the greatest possible opportunity for recovery. It is more than a building. It is a promise kept to this community.

We are also proud to now offer limited primary healthcare services alongside our substance use disorder and mental health programming, rooted in the belief that physical health is inseparable from lasting recovery. By integrating medical, mental health, and substance use disorder services under one continuum, we are better positioned to treat the whole person. We have continued to grow through strategic partnerships with nonprofits who share our mission, and we will keep pursuing these collaborations to ensure communities receive the services they need.

Cenikor is not immune to the financial pressures facing the nonprofit sector today. What distinguishes us is a business model built for resilience, one that balances government-funded services for indigent clients with commercial insurance relationships. This past year, we invested more than \$7.16 million of organizational resources to bridge the gap between the true cost of care and HHSC funding, ensuring that the ability to pay never became a barrier to treatment. Our model allows us to honor that commitment while maintaining a strong financial foundation.

The reduction in government funding has only increased the need for organizations like Cenikor that offer a diversified, sustainable approach to care. Staff are choosing Cenikor because they trust in our stability and our future. We will continue to grow, expand access, and invest in innovative approaches that strengthen outcomes for those we serve. This includes the introduction of our Phases of Care framework, designed to provide the right support at the right time and create a clearer pathway through recovery. By helping individuals move from stabilization to growth and long-term wellness, this approach reflects our belief that recovery happens in stages, but support should never end. We will continue to keep a disciplined watch on the economic landscape, guided by our commitment to providing the care, connection, and support for lifelong recovery. The need for our services is not diminishing. If anything, it is growing. And we intend to meet it.

Governance & Growth: Strengthening the Mission

Cenikor's continuum of care offers eight different levels of treatment, each customized to the client's situation, and this flexibility is at the heart of what makes the nonprofit model so vital right now.

"Our priorities for the past few years are strengthening management," John says. "This is critical for clinical competency and expanding our mission. We've determined that we have some great leadership on board and we'll continue to attract leadership from other industries, and you need a mix of both. Our model is unique to the recovery realm, not only in the way that it efficiently delivers service, but that service is so effective. We get real results with our integrated, whole-person care experience and approach."

Looking ahead, expansion is squarely in focus. "One of the priorities we can talk about is Cenikor expanding its geographical reach beyond our borders. We don't want another facility in Texas right now; we want to have another in another state. We want to expand our footprint. We have upgraded the majority of our facilities in the last four years so that we can better offer quality care."

Making Every Action Count

Hope is not passive. At Cenikor, hope is a phone call answered at 2 a.m. It is a detox bed available when someone is finally ready. It is a counselor who has lived the same story and refuses to let a client give up. It is a recovery support specialist who shows up not just at transition, but a year later, still checking in.

This is what "Support for Lifelong Recovery" looks like in practice. Every day, across multiple locations and growing in Texas and New Mexico, our teams are doing the hard, necessary, and life-changing work of meeting people where they are with no shame, no barriers, and no exceptions.

Access to care is not just about geography. It is about affordability, trust, timing, and the knowledge that help is available no matter what you look like, where you come from, or how many times you have tried before. Cenikor accepts everyone. We work with every major insurance provider. We offer grant-funded and state-supported options. And we never turn someone away simply because they cannot pay.

Recovery is a lifelong journey. Our continuum of care, from prevention through aftercare, is designed to support clients at every phase of their journey. Recovery support specialists and alumni communities provide peer support because hope requires a lifetime of action and connection, and we are committed to providing both.

Before coming to Cenikor, his life revolved around drinking, late nights, and a cycle he couldn't break. He was on the verge of losing everything: his job, his stability, and his relationship with his kids. He grew up surrounded by alcoholism. Both of his parents struggled with drinking, and for a long time he feared he would carry that same cycle into the next generation.

During treatment at Cenikor's Farmington facility, he learned to finally prioritize himself and his recovery. "Cenikor gave me the tools, support, and resources I needed to build a sober life and realize there is so much more to life than alcohol and temporary escapes." Today he is sober, spending quality time with his kids, enjoying sports, and truly living again. His mantra is simple: the cycle ends with me.

He went into Odyssey House not knowing what to expect. What he found was something he hadn't anticipated: real conversations, daily growth, and people who genuinely cared.

Before treatment, life felt chaotic and exhausting. He was stuck in unhealthy patterns, avoiding problems instead of facing them, and feeling disconnected from who he really was. Treatment helped him slow down and look at himself honestly. He learned healthier coping skills, how to communicate, and how to recognize the triggers holding him back. He also began a deeper journey: reconnecting with his cultural identity as Dine (Navajo) and discovering the Wellbriety program, a recovery path rooted in Indigenous healing traditions.

Today his life is more stable, clear, and meaningful. His relationships are healthier, he is more present, and he has goals for his future. He hopes one day to become certified in Wellbriety and carry those teachings to his own people.

Today she has a safe place to sleep, food, an ID, and a job. Most importantly, she feels hopeful about her future.

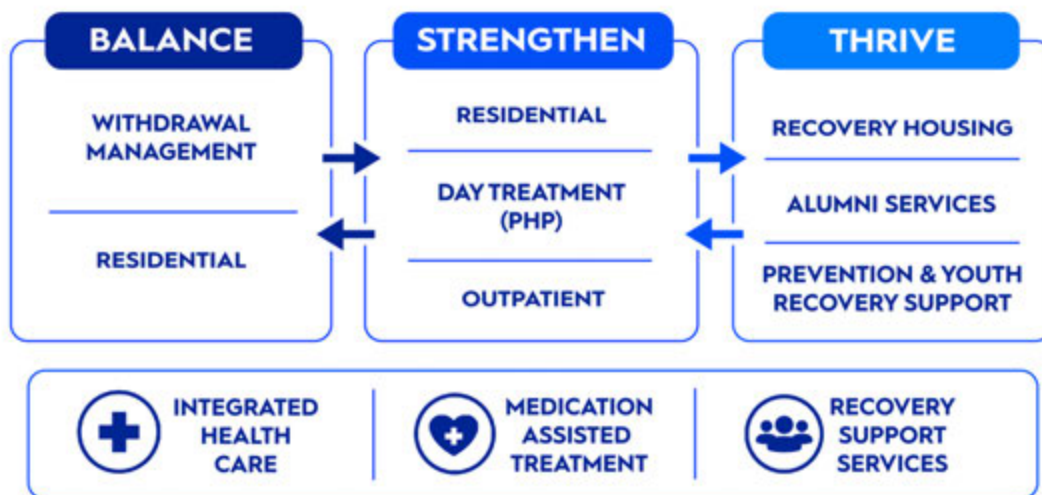

At Cenikor, the Phases of Care framework was designed to meet people where they are and provide the right support at the right time in their recovery journey. By creating a clear pathway between Balance to Strengthen to Thrive, we help clients build a stronger foundation for lasting recovery while reducing gaps in care and improving long-term outcomes. Cenikor's Integrated care is a coordinated healthcare approach that combines primary care and mental health services to address an individual's physical, behavioral, and emotional health needs through a unified treatment plan. The model reflects our belief that recovery happens in phases, but support should last a lifetime.

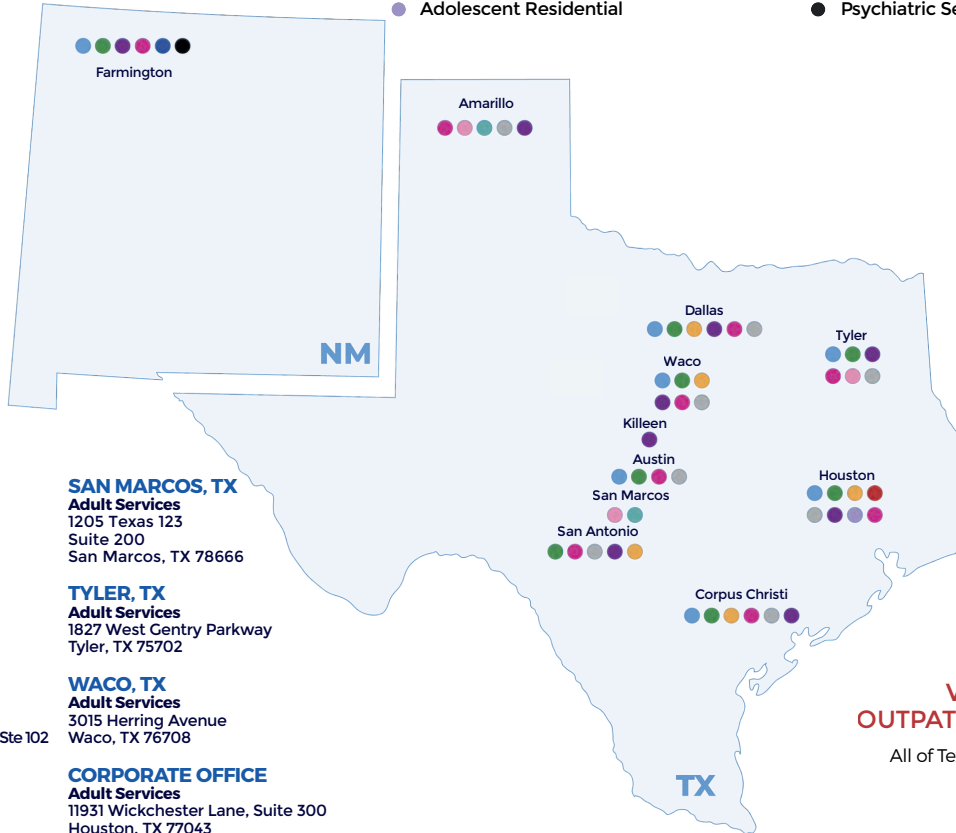

Cenikor currently operates across Texas and New Mexico, offering inpatient, outpatient (both virtual and in-person), MAT, prevention and YRC, and recovery support services. From rural communities to major urban centers in Houston, Dallas-Fort Worth, San Antonio, and Austin, our footprint reflects our commitment to reaching people wherever they are.

The new Corpus Christi facility marks a significant expansion of our Gulf Coast presence with a dedicated veterans wing, full continuum of care, and a 24/7 admissions model designed to minimize barriers to treatment.

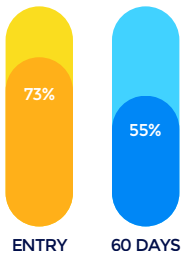

Looking Ahead: Cenikor is actively exploring expansion for improved access to quality care.

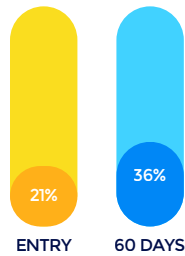

CLINICAL EXCELLENCE IN ACTION

At Cenikor, clinical care is built around a simple but powerful truth: people are not diagnoses. They are whole human beings who deserve whole-person care.

"Treating the whole person means recognizing that health is influenced by physical, emotional, social, and practical factors," says Dr. George. "Lasting improvement happens when these areas are addressed together."

The approach is phase-based and organized around where each client is in their recovery journey, not a predetermined timeline. Balance. Strengthen. Thrive.

"Clinical teams meet clients where they are," he explains, "and walk with them as their needs evolve."

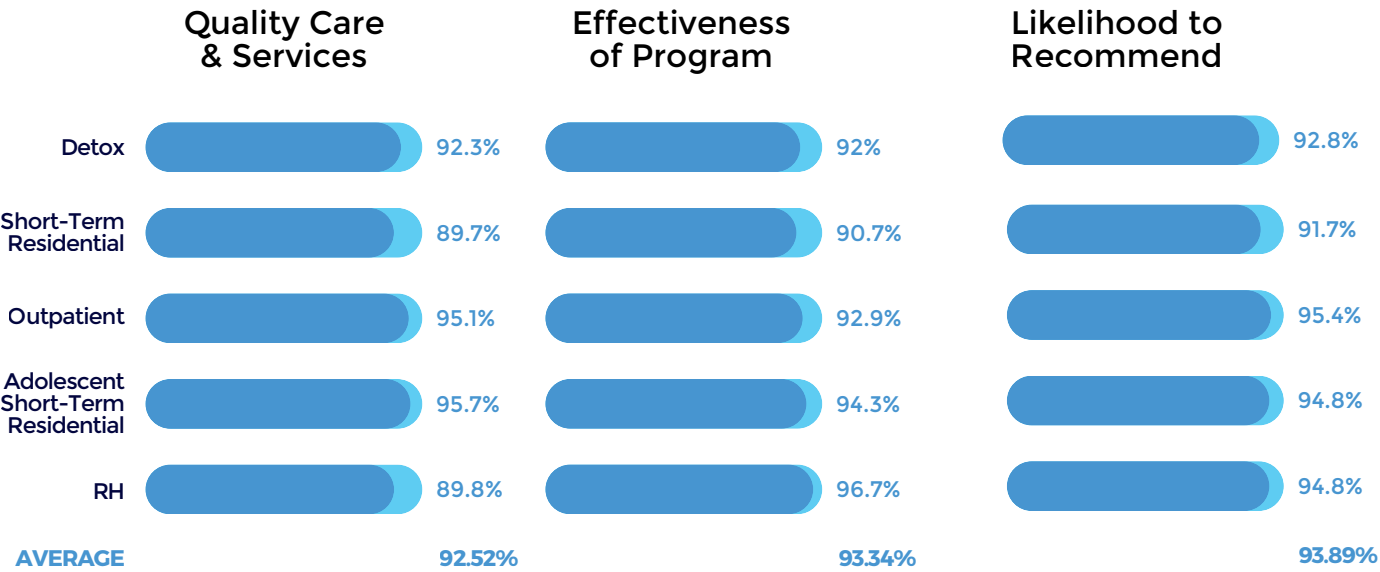
Medication-assisted treatment plays a central role. "MAT keeps people alive, engaged, and stable long enough for recovery to take hold," he says. In early phases it supports safety and stabilization and as clients progress, it provides a protective foundation for growing independence. "When integrated into individualized, phase-based treatment, MAT substantially increases the likelihood of long-term recovery."

"By grounding treatment in phases rather than rigid timelines, clinical teams honor each client's individual experience while still providing structured, evidence-based care."

Outpatient care continues to play a vital role in removing barriers to treatment and meeting individuals where they are, both in their daily lives and along their recovery journey. Through in-person and virtual services available across Texas, Cenikor expands access to care for individuals who may otherwise face geographic, transportation, or scheduling challenges. While the industry benchmark for outpatient client engagement is approximately 85%, Cenikor outpatient programs have consistently exceeded this standard and are well on the way to becoming best in class.

Outpatient services address real-world challenges such as employment obligations, childcare responsibilities, and transportation limitations. Financial accessibility is another critical factor: Cenikor offers a lower-cost alternative while leveraging Medicaid, commercial insurance, and state-funded programs to further reduce financial burden.

Recovery today requires flexibility, and Cenikor's outpatient programs are designed to adapt to evolving client needs. For many individuals, flexibility means the ability to maintain employment, attend school, or care for family members while actively participating in treatment. It also means access to varied therapeutic approaches, including group counseling, individual sessions, and peer support.

Flexibility also means ensuring care is culturally and linguistically accessible. Through Spanish Supportive Outpatient services, Cenikor meets the needs of Spanish-speaking clients by providing treatment in their preferred language, strengthening therapeutic connection and increasing engagement so that language is never an obstacle to care.

Over the past year, outpatient programs have seen a shift in client complexity: increasingly, individuals present with co-occurring mental health and substance use disorders. In response, Cenikor has expanded services to include women's-only outpatient groups focused on trauma-informed care, creating a safe, supportive environment where women can address both substance use and its underlying causes.

Outpatient treatment supports long-term recovery by allowing clients to apply recovery skills in real time within their everyday environments. Rather than separating individuals from their daily lives, outpatient care integrates treatment into daily routines through both in-person and virtual services available across Texas, building the coping strategies, accountability, and community connection that are essential to sustained recovery.

PREVENTION FIRST: REACHING THE NEXT GENERATION

Prevention is not a footnote to Cenikor's mission; it is the core of it. "Prevention is foundational because it allows us to address substance use and behavioral health challenges before they escalate into crisis-level needs," says Kail Winfrey-Gorzek. "While treatment is essential, prevention can reduce the number of individuals who may need that level of care."

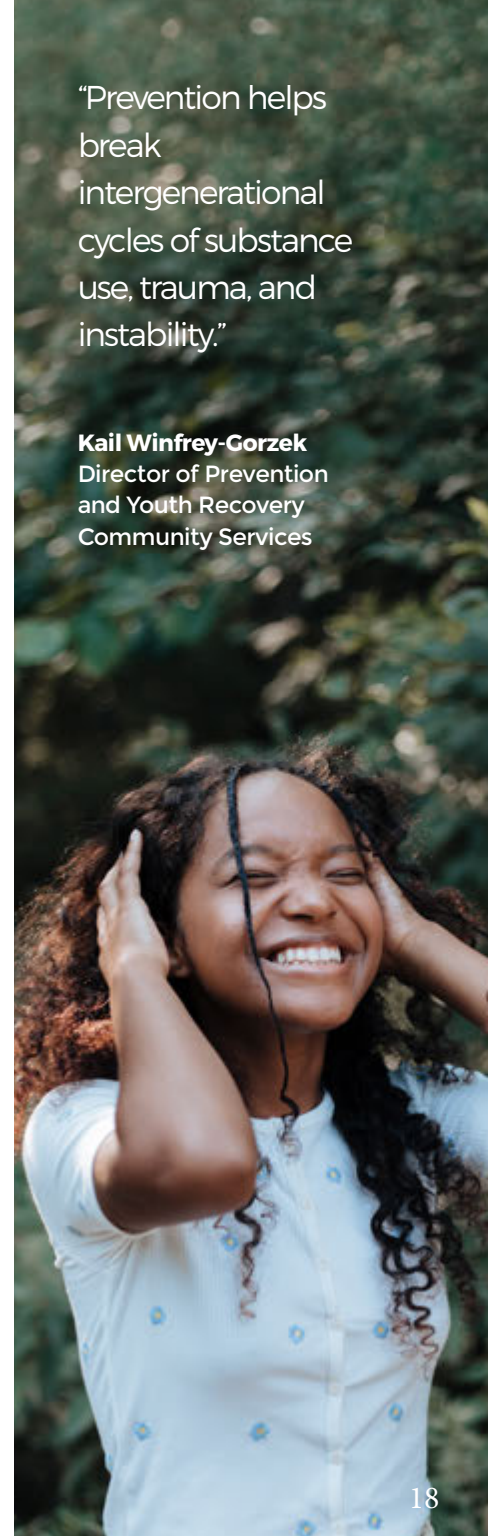
Cenikor reaches youth through school-based programs serving elementary through high school students, evidence-informed curricula focused on decision-making, coping skills, and emotional regulation, and community partnerships with Independent School Districts (ISDs), colleges, and youth-serving organizations. Formats are interactive and relatable by offering real-life scenarios, peer-informed conversations, and safe spaces where young people can talk openly about mental health and substance use.

The trends Kail's team is tracking are sobering: increased normalization of vaping and cannabis at younger ages, greater exposure to fentanyl through unintentional polysubstance use, and rising GAD (Generalized Anxiety Disorder) and depression linked to social media and isolation. But there is also opportunity. "Youth have a strong desire for honest, non-judgmental conversations," she says, "and greater openness to prevention messaging when it is relevant, respectful, culturally responsive, and practical."

The long-term impact is generational. Prevention builds resilience, improves mental health outcomes, reduces justice system involvement, and strengthens community connection, which are all skills that individuals carry into adulthood and pass on to their own families.

BEYOND TREATMENT: LIFELONG RECOVERY

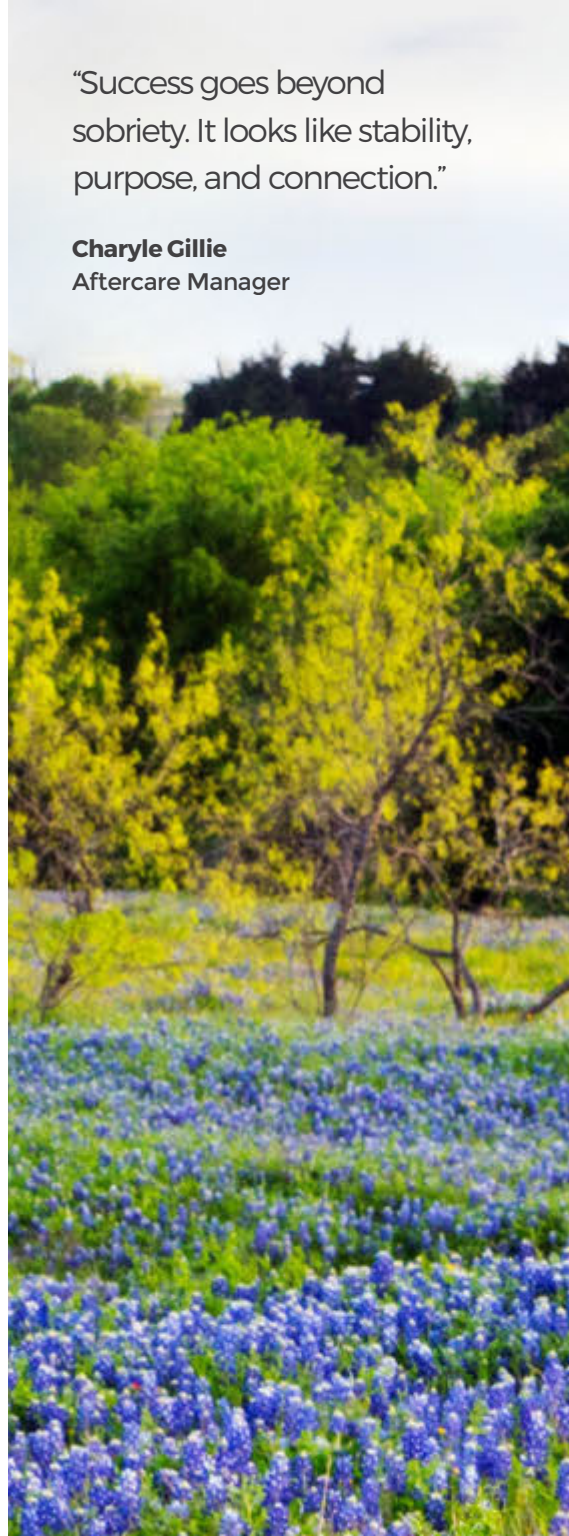

Transition is not the finish line. For Cenikor's Recovery Coaches and Recovery Support Services team (RSS), supporting clients beyond treatment is where the real work begins. “After treatment, the focus shifts from stabilization to sustainability,” she says. Clients are connected to RSS, alumni programming, and community resources so they are not navigating life after treatment alone.

“Recovery doesn't stop when treatment ends; that's when real-life challenges start,” Charyle explains. Recovery support specialists provide ongoing connection, accountability, and peer support from people who understand the process firsthand.

That reduces isolation, builds confidence, and gives clients practical tools to maintain long-term recovery. Alumni engagement is one of the strongest predictors of long-term success. Through panels, events, and ongoing communication, alumni are reminded they are not alone and that they have a community to return to. “It also gives them opportunities to give back,” Charyle says, “which strengthens their own recovery.”

And what does success ultimately look like? “Success goes beyond sobriety,” she says. “It looks like stability, purpose, and connection. Maintaining employment, rebuilding relationships, showing up consistently, or simply handling life's challenges in a healthier way. It's about creating a life that someone wants to stay sober for.”





THE FIRST CALL: WHERE RECOVERY BEGINS

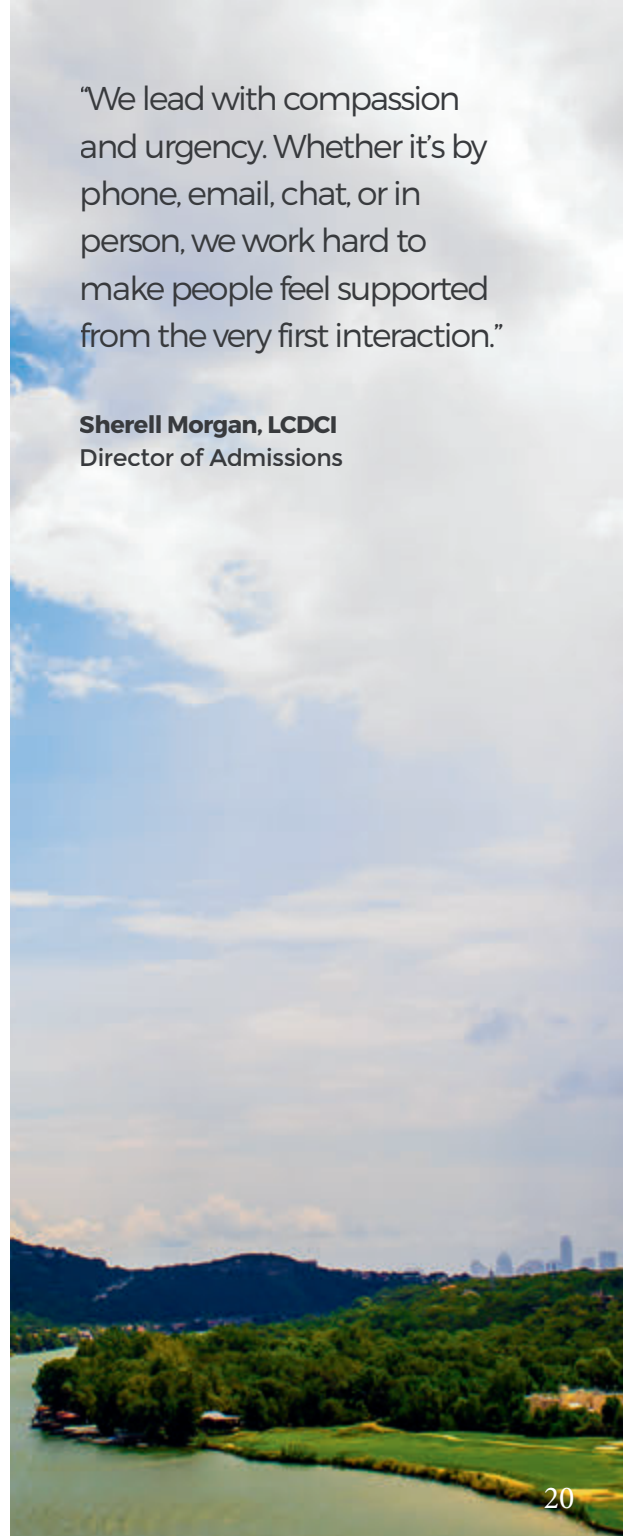
For many people, the call to Cenikor is the hardest call they will ever make. Sherell Morgan and the admissions team understand this, and they treat every inquiry accordingly.

"What families need most when they first reach out is to feel welcomed," Sherell says, "and to know that help is accessible and available." The most common concerns are insurance coverage, bed availability, and how quickly care can begin. The Cenikor Admissions team addresses all of them with compassion, specificity, and a commitment to moving quickly.

"We try to make the process feel less overwhelming," she explains. "Being compassionate, informative, and meeting clients where they are, all while walking them through each step." That approach is what makes Cenikor's first interaction feel different. Not a transaction. A lifeline.

Cenikor's presence in the community extends far beyond the walls of its treatment facilities. Through our dedicated Client Outreach team, we actively engage with schools, hospitals, court systems, shelters, employers, and community organizations to ensure individuals and families can access support, resources, and pathways to recovery.

"Cenikor shows up by being present, accessible, and engaged," says Sara Buckler. "Through outreach initiatives, partnerships, alumni involvement, and community collaborations, we work to meet individuals and families where they are and connect them with the support they need."

Throughout the year, outreach efforts strengthened relationships with referral partners, healthcare providers, judicial systems, employers, and community organizations across every region Cenikor serves. Team members regularly participate in educational events, professional training, recovery celebrations, prevention initiatives, and community forums, helping to foster understanding and promote hope.

Alumni engagement and recovery support services play a vital role in extending Cenikor's impact beyond treatment. By maintaining connections with individuals after discharge and encouraging involvement in recovery communities, Cenikor reinforces the message that healing continues well after treatment ends. This commitment is further strengthened through the implementation of our Phases of Care framework, which creates clearer pathways for support at any stage in the recovery journey. As the organization grows, community engagement remains central to its mission and to creating more opportunities for individuals and families to find hope, healing, and lifelong recovery.

Stronger Together: Building Meaningful Partnerships

For Kim, the impact of collaborative partnerships is ultimately personal. "A strong partnership is grounded in shared values and a belief that recovery is possible," she says. "Partnerships help bridge funding and resource gaps that would otherwise limit treatment." When those gaps close, clients experience something they may never have had before: a network of people and resources fully invested in their success.

"Many clients encounter love, consistency, and community for the first time, often becoming the foundation that changes the trajectory of their lives."



Successful partnerships at Cenikor Waco are built on a shared commitment to helping individuals achieve lasting recovery. Lindsay emphasizes clear communication, mutual accountability, and alignment across the full continuum of care. "Our partners work alongside us to ensure clients are supported at every stage, with a focus on proactive coordination, timely follow-through, and seamless transitions before transition occurs."

Partnerships expand access to care by creating efficient referral pathways and reducing barriers that often delay treatment. Through collaboration with local providers, law enforcement, and community agencies, Cenikor Waco connects clients to the appropriate level of care quickly and ensures they leave with confirmed next steps. These relationships also help address critical needs such as transportation, documentation, and basic resources, making it easier for individuals to enter and remain engaged in treatment.

Cenikor Waco collaborates with a wide range of organizations, including hospitals and behavioral health providers, law enforcement and criminal justice partners, community coalitions, housing programs, workforce development agencies, and local colleges. Together, these relationships address not only clinical needs, but also the social and environmental factors that shape whether recovery holds.

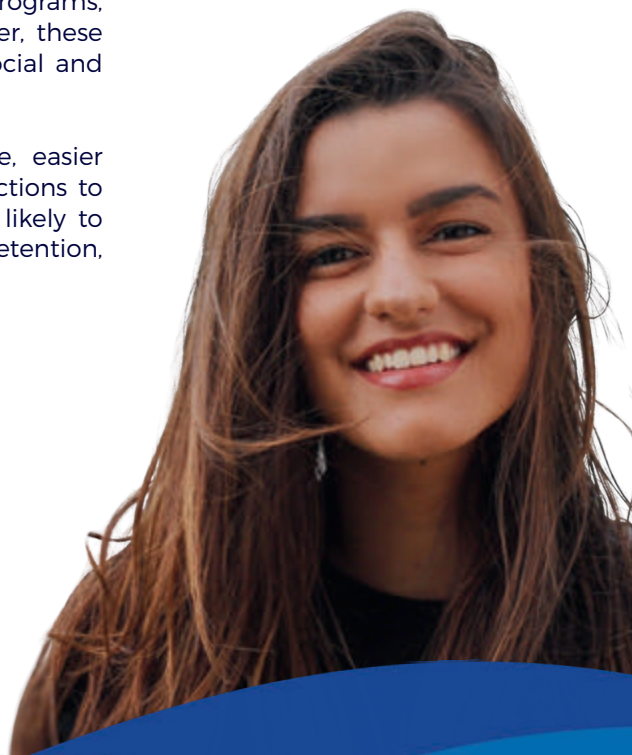

Our People: Employees & Culture

Cenikor's greatest strength is its people. With over 500 employees, our workforce is as diverse and dedicated as the communities we serve. Many of our staff members are themselves in recovery; they bring lived experience to their work every day and prove to every client who walks through our doors that recovery is real and possible.

"Our culture is rooted in the belief that second chances are not exceptions; they are the rule. We extend that same philosophy to our team.

Cenikor invests in its employees through the LEAD professional development program, license renewal, tuition reimbursement, competitive benefits, and a retirement program that goes beyond what most nonprofits offer, including a 5% employer contribution with no employee contribution required and immediate 100% vesting, plus an additional 5% employer match for participating employees.

This commitment reflects our belief that supporting employees means investing not only in the work they do today, but also in their long-term financial future."

People Behind the Mission

What makes Cenikor's culture truly distinct, according to Kellee Webb, is who shows up to do the work. "About 65% of all our team members are in recovery themselves," she says. "They are on the same recovery journey as our clients." That shared experience creates something that cannot be manufactured: a culture rooted in genuine empathy, accountability, and hope.

Employees live out Cenikor's mission through every interaction, not just in clinical settings, but in the hallways, the break rooms, and the difficult conversations. "Whether it's offering encouragement, holding someone accountable with compassion, celebrating progress, or simply being a steady presence on a hard day," Kellee says, "our team members make the mission real through small acts of care and dignity."

Staff with lived experience bring something no credential can replicate. "They can look at someone in one of the hardest seasons of life and say, without judgment or stigma, 'I understand,' and truly mean it," she explains. That connection lowers shame, builds trust, and reminds clients that recovery is not just a concept; it is a reality that people around them are living every day.

And the concept of second chances extends in every direction. "At Cenikor, second chances means we do not define people by their worst day or their hardest chapter," Kellee says. "A second chance is not about lowering standards; it is about holding onto hope while walking alongside someone as they do the hard work of recovery and growth."

That philosophy shows up in how Cenikor invests in its own team. In fiscal year 2025 alone, Cenikor promoted 24 employees, reflecting a culture that actively creates pathways for growth and recognizes the talent already within its walls.

Among the features she is most proud of: a dedicated veterans wing where those who have served can focus on recovery alongside peers who share similar experiences. "We provide specialized curricula tailored to both combat and non-combat veterans," she says. "Care that is relevant, respectful, and effective."

Crystal's own growth has mirrored the organization's. She has been mentored by executive leadership, represented underserved voices in community conversations, and collaborated with partners across cities to close service gaps. "Cenikor's potential is far-reaching," she says. "This feels like just the beginning."

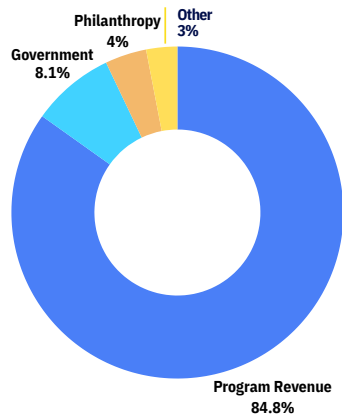

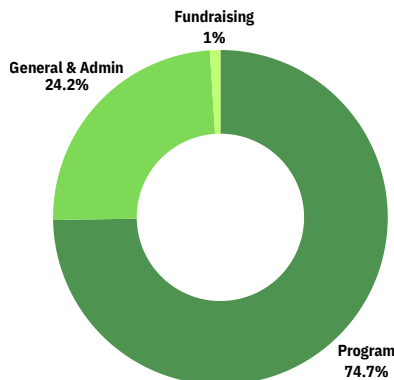
This year, Cenikor continued to navigate the dual pressures facing all nonprofit healthcare providers: rising costs and a complex reimbursement landscape. By expanding our commercial and higher-tier payer relationships, improving operational efficiency, and diversifying our funding matrix, we have maintained a strong financial foundation, even in a challenging environment.

Our funding model includes state contracts, Medicaid, commercial insurance, philanthropic giving, and government grants. This diversification is intentional and strategic. It allows Cenikor to serve clients across all income levels, including those whose care is fully grant- or scholarship-funded, all without compromising quality.
